### HOMICIDE INVESTIGATION 1641 EAST ENKE DRIVE

**\*\*\*UPDATE – January 26, 2021\*\*\***

As the investigation continued into the fatal shooting of 20-year-old **Forrest Beckett Keys**, Tucson Police Homicide Detectives were able to identify a suspect and make an arrest.

On February 25, 2021, through efforts of the Tucson Police Department and the University of Arizona Police Department, Homicide Detectives identified and arrested 17-year-old **Alonzo Orosco**. He was subsequently booked into Pima County Jail and has been charged with 1<sup>st</sup> Degree Murder and Drive-by Shooting.

Detectives are continuing the investigation and are currently seeking additional witnesses and suspects. Anyone with information is urged to call 911 or 88-CRIME. You can remain anonymous. Additional information will be released as it becomes available.

On February 20, 2021, just after 11:00 p.m., officers from the University of Arizona Police Department responded to reports of a shooting at 1641 E. Enke Dr., a multi-story parking garage. Officers from UAPD responded to the initial shooting and contacted the Tucson Police Department shortly after to assist in the investigation portion. The victim has been identified as 20-year-old **Forrest Beckett Keys**. Next of kin has been notified.

Detectives with the Tucson Police Department Homicide Unit responded to continue the investigation. Detectives learned that Mr. Keys was walking home at approximately 11:03 p.m. when a red or maroon Cadillac sedan passed by Mr. Keys. An argument ensued for reasons unknown and soon after shots were fired. Mr. Keys was located by UAPD with gunshot trauma.

Detectives are asking for help identifying the vehicle involved. Below is a picture of the suspect vehicle and detectives believe it is a 2006-2011, red or maroon Cadillac DTS. Details are limited at this time and additional information will be released as it becomes available. There are no suspects in custody and detectives are asking anyone with information to call 88-CRIME. You can remain anonymous.
